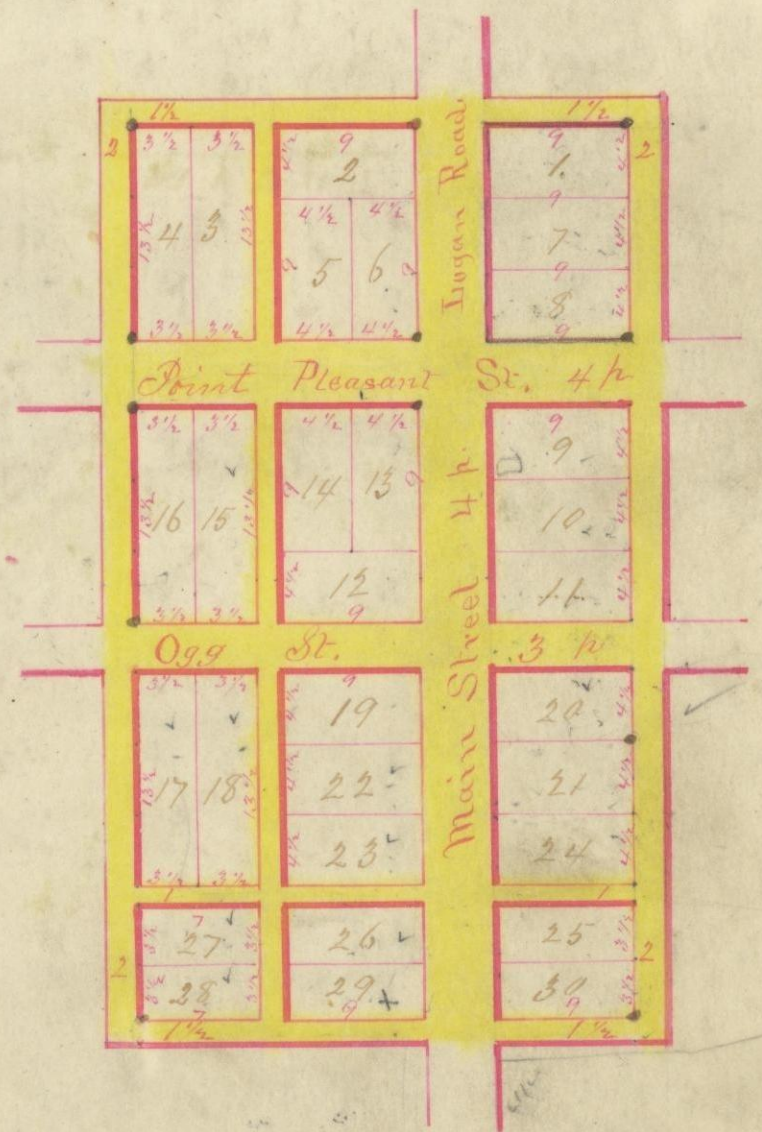


Plat of the Town of Desboro,

as laid out at the request of Henry Des on the 12th April 1838.
 Scale 3 Chains to an inch.

Platted on a scale of twelve poles to an inch.
 A plan of the survey of the town of Desboro in the Township of Washington in the County of Hocking on the 12th day of April A.D. 1838, at the request of Henry Des.
 The following is the descriptive notes of said Town:
 Beginning twentytwo poles and twentyone links South of the North West corner of Section No 22. T. N. 13 R. N. 17 thence south to the south west corner of Lot No 28, for a further description see plat. Main street is 4 poles wide and bears N. 51' west the other streets and alleys in the same proportions. Lots No 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, & 30 contain 24 poles and $\frac{52}{100}$. The lots that have stones set at their corners are as follows, No 1 NE; No 2 NE; No 4 NW & SW; 6 SE; 8 SE; 13, NE; 16, NW & SW; 20, SE; 28, SW. 23, SE. Public Lots are nine and twenty nine.
