James Hankinson wife to Jonathan Kimble Deed  
This Indenture made this fourteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine by and between James Hankinson and Mary Hankinson his wife of the County of Hocking in the State of Ohio of the one part and Jonathan Kimble of the County of Hocking and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said James Hankinson and Mary Hankinson his wife for and in consideration of the just sum of thirty Dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have given granted bargained sold released conveyed and do by these presents give grant bargain sell release convey and confirm unto the said Jonathan Kimble his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land situate and

being in the County of Hocking State of Ohio the above tract being a part of the South East quarter of Section four Township thirteen Range Seventeen in the East side bounded as follows commencing at a stone on the South West side of Jonathan Kimble's field, running North one half East Ten chains and eighteen links to a stone, thence South 65 West eight chains forty links to a stone, thence South 25 East Nine chains 31 links to the place of beginning the above to contain four acres to have and to hold the premises aforesaid with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining unto the said Jonathan Kimble and unto his heirs and assigns forever. And the said James Hankinson and Mary Hankinson his wife for themselves and for their heirs executors and administrators Covenant and promise to and with the said Jonathan Kimble his heirs and assigns that they the said James Hankinson and Mary Hankinson his wife are lawfully seized of the premises aforesaid that they have good right and lawful authority to sell and convey the same in manner aforesaid and that the premises are free and clear of and from all incumbrances whatever. And further that they the said James Hankinson and Mary Hankinson his wife will well and truly warrant and forever defend the premises herein and hereby granted unto the said Jonathan Kimble and unto his heirs and assigns against all lawful claims and demands of all and every person whomsoever.
