

HOMER CALL DIES

Willard, July 12.—Homer Call, one of Willard's influential citizens, died today, after an illness of a month. Mr. Call was one of the pioneers of Boxelder county, having come here in 1851. He settled in Willard and has been a resident here ever since. He has always been one of the city's substantial citizens and held several positions of honor and trust. At the time of his death he was 75 years old, having lived the last twenty-five years alone, his wife preceding him by that number of years. Mr. Call has a twin brother living in Willard, and the two, Homer and Omer, had been in partnership much of their lives.
